


"Rather than love, than money, than fame, give me truth" (Thoreau).



Henry David Thoreau was born over 200 years ago in Concord, Massachusetts. That's 44 years before the start of the Civil War in 1861.

He lived on Walden Pond from 1845 to 1847.

The land on which Thoreau built his cabin was owned by his friend Ralph Waldo Emerson, a writer and thinker of that time.

## TRANSCENDENTALISM

"A 19th-century school of American theological and philosophical thought that combined <u>respect for nature</u> and <u>self-sufficiency</u> with elements of Unitarianism and German Romanticism. Writer Ralph Waldo Emerson was the primary practitioner of the movement, which existed loosely in Massachusetts in the early 1800s before becoming an organized group in the 1830s."
