One of the most famous romances of all time, Wuthering Heights tells the story of Heathcliff and Cathy, who are raised in the same household on the wild moors of England. The pair become passionate soul mates whose love soon grows into a dangerous obsession that cannot be contained, even in death.

Weather

Keeps Wuthering Heights in tumult; symbolizes the passionate emotions of the characters

Moors

Symbolize the passion and danger—of Heathcliff and Cathy's childhood love

Ghosts

Represent memory and obsession; Cathy's ghost haunts Heathcliff

Hair

Symbolizes the intertwined lives of the characters

EMILY BRONTË 1818-48




